

Important Information

Arrival	
Students who are flying	<p>You will be picked up from Dunedin Airport by Telford staff and dropped back on Saturday morning to meet your flight bookings.</p> <p>Telford is a 45 minute drive from Dunedin Airport. There will be three pick ups from the airport and Telford drivers will hold a sign with Telford name written on it, so keep an eye out for that. They will have a list of your names so will not leave until they have found you.</p>
Students arriving by bus	<p>The drop off point is in Balclutha, and you will be collected from there</p>
Students who are driving	<p>Please arrive between 3 and 4pm, and report to <u>hostel office</u> upon arrival.</p> <p>Telford is situated 6 klm from Balclutha, on the Owaka Highway, (Scenic Route Road). If you have any trouble finding us, please call Telford or myself.</p> <p>Once you have arrived, car keys will be handed into the hostel Manager, and returned for departure.</p>
Everyone	Please advise me of all travel plans, whether by car, bus or flight bookings by email
Departure	<p>Students will depart after breakfast on the last day. When we have all of the information on departure times for flights and bus travel you will be advised on the departure arrangements.</p>
Dietary Requirements	<p>Vegetarians or those with food allergies Please be sure to advise me of special dietary requirements.</p>
Medication	<p>Please be sure to pack any medication which is required. If you need an inhaler, make sure you pack it! There are bees on campus, so if you have an allergy to bee stings, please make sure you bring the correct medication for this.</p>
Leaving Campus	<p>No student will be permitted to leave campus, except with pre planned parental approval (written confirmation required)</p> <p>On the final night, if you have family in the district they are welcome to visit you on campus.</p> <p>Those with approval to leave may do so after 4.30pm on the on the final night, but must have returned to campus by 10.00pm. Contact cellphone numbers must be made available</p>

Steel Cap (preferable)</p> <p>Rural Veterinary Students: Protective clothing – boots that have to pass a biosecurity inspection beforehand and strongly recommended to have clean overalls and/ or clean leggings.</p> <p>Forestry Students Must bring wet weather Gear and Steel capped boots</p>	
<p>What students must NOT bring: Cigarettes, alcohol, drugs, fire-arms & knives, or bad language!</p>
